Scholarship Foundation Processing 2025 Applications

This time of year our Scholarship Foundation is pretty busy. In the early part of March, we solicit scholarship applications from the Sahuarita School District's three high schools. This year we received 37 applications.

Those applications are pretty extensive, requiring applicants to supply transcripts, letters of reference, test scores, family financial information and a written essay. The applications are then reviewed in detail by Foundation members, and the 10 most promising applicants upon which there is a consensus are invited to sit for a personal interview.

From those interviews, five students are selected to be awarded scholarships. Alternates are also named in the event a selectee isn't able to attend. These scholarships are in the amount of \$5000 per year and are renewable for 4 years.

Our Scholarship Foundation is a separate entity from the White Elephant proper; however, the scholarships are funded annually by a grant from the latter. The long-term plan of the Foundation is to build up up an endowment sufficient to award the scholarships without outside help. Our current endowment is a bit over \$2 million and is invested conservatively.

Those foundation members currently serving are Tom Cooke (President), Sue Woodward (Treasurer and pro tem Secretary), Judy Oestreich (Secretary), Bill Taylor, Jim Luhring and Cindy Jacobson.

Our scholarships are available both for university training as well as vocational. Last year in honor of the White Elephant's 60th anniversary, we awarded an extra academic and two vocational awards. This year that program won't be renewed, and the funds will instead be added to our endowment.

The plan is our endowment, once we reach our goal, will continue to provide scholarships in the name of our White Elephant organization in perpetuity. This will be our legacy to the future—made possible by the hard work and dedication of our volunteers. We can all take pride in this extraordinary achievement. So pat yourself on your back!
